

Clowning practice in the streets

This N.A.To^{\cdot} will be held from 9.11 - 12.11.2023 (Arrival on the 8th) in Budapest

The Nose Assembly for Tomorrow is a 4-day workshop where clowning practices around social-ecological topics are explored. In this Nose Assembly, people from different disciplines will come together to discover and exchange practices. Whether you are new to clowning, or have been doing it forever, everyone is invited to join this assembly and explore clowning together.

A cooperation between Inspiral Circus Centre, clowning collective tYhle, and Theatre of the Oppressed Vienna, each of which will provide workshops about their vision, research, methods, and practices. Together with a maximum of 20 participants, the methods will be tested, merged and serve as practice-based frameworks for applying clowning practice for personal and social transformation. Hosted by the Inspiral Circus Centre in Budapest, this N.A.To-session will use discussion, play, and experimentation to dive into some big questions, such as:

- Can clowns be activists?
- What can we borrow from art movements and theatre forms to increase awareness about the importance of social-ecological change?
- Is the clown equipped to deal with power and make real change?

- Street theatre and direct actions by TO Vienna
- Circus practice by Inspiral: the art of clowning and juggling from a traditional, philosophical and technical perspective
- Introduction to Soundpainting as a clownfrontational tactic by tYhle

Please, send us a text (max. 3600 characters) or a video/audio (max. 5 minutes). The text/video/audio should be about you and what interests you have in social issues and activism and its intersections with clowning practice and street performance.
